DONALD J. MCKINNEY is the newly appointed director of bands at the University of Colorado Boulder. Previously, he was the band conductor for Interlochen Arts Academy, and during the summer, he returns as the coordinator of bands for Interlochen Arts Camp. Prior to his appointment at CU Boulder, he was director of wind ensembles and associate professor at Louisiana State University School of Music. From 2004 to 2007, he was the associate conductor of ensembles at the Duquesne University Mary Pappert School of Music where he assisted with the wind ensembles, orchestra, and opera workshop. Dr. McKinney has published articles in five volumes of *Teaching Music through Performance in Band*, and has also authored a chapter about composer Jennifer Higdon for the book *Women of Influence in Contemporary Music*. He was named a finalist for the 2011 Thelma A. Robinson Award by the Conductors Guild, and has been nominated for a LSU Alumni Association Faculty Excellence Award. As a guest conductor, he has collaborated with the Dallas Wind Symphony and is an active clinician and conductor for high school honor bands. Dr. McKinney holds degrees from Duquesne University, Indiana University of Pennsylvania, and the University of Michigan.

SCOTT TEEPLE serves on the conducting faculty at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, where he conducts the concert band, the wind ensemble, and teaches undergraduate and graduate conducting. During the academic year, he conducts the Winds of Wisconsin, an honors band comprised of high school musicians from around the state and the MATC Municipal Band. In 2013, Mr. Teeple will guest conduct bands at both the American School in Singapore and the IASAS Cultural Festival. Recently, the UWWE recorded their first CD and also recorded the *Concerto for Euphonium* by John Stevens. Before his appointment at the University of Wisconsin, Mr. Teeple

served on the faculty at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point, the University of Michigan, St. Clair County Community College (MI) and Port Huron Northern High School (MI). He has served on the executive board of the Wisconsin Music Educators' Association and on the Arts Alliance Executive Board. Currently, Mr. Teeple serves as treasurer of the Big Ten Band Director's Association. He received degrees in music education and conducting from the University of Michigan where he studied with H. Robert Reynolds.
