Bruce Hornsby & The Noisemakers Monday, June 20, 2022 - 7:30 p.m., Kresge Auditorium

Lauded as "the sound of grace on the radio" (Rolling Stone), singer, pianist, composer, and bandleader Bruce Hornsby remains in-demand as a performer and collaborator. Since the title track of his debut album The Way It Is topped the charts on BBC Radio One, the three-time Grammy Award winner has sold 11 million albums and worked with diverse artists such as Bob Dylan, Bonnie Raitt, Chaka Khan, and The Grateful Dead. Join Hornsby and his current band, The Noisemakers, for an evening of classic hits that span rock, pop, bluegrass, and jazz.

An Acoustic Evening with Trey Anastasio Tuesday, June 21, 2022 - 7:30 p.m., Kresge Auditorium

As a founding member of Phish, one of the most successful, and innovative rock bands of all time, composer/guitarist/vocalist Trey Anastasio has forged a multi-faceted, Grammynominated career spanning numerous genres. He's collaborated with artists such as Dave Matthews, Herbie Hancock, Carlos Santana, Toots and the Maytals, B. B. King and The Roots, performed his original compositions with numerous symphonies including the New York Philharmonic and the Los Angeles Philharmonic, and received a Tony-nomination for Best Original Score for the music he co-wrote for the Broadway musical, *Hands on a Hardbody*. DARIUS RUCKER LIVE with special guest Tyler Booth Saturday, June 25, 2022 - 7:30 p.m., Kresge Auditorium

Singer-songwriter Darius Rucker first achieved multi-platinum status as the founder, lead singer, and rhythm guitarist of the Grammy Award-winning rock band Hootie & the Blowfish. In 2008, Rucker embarked on a solo career in country music, earning scores of new fans with number-one hits such as "Don't Think I Don't Think About It," "Alright," and "Come Back Song." Since then, Rucker has added four number-one albums, his third Grammy Award, and membership in the Grand Ole Opry to his ever-growing list of accolades. Up-and-coming country artist Tyler Booth will join Rucker for the performance.

More than 400 years after its premiere, Shakespeare's *Othello* continues to captivate audiences with its enduring themes of treachery, jealousy, revenge, and racial prejudice. When Moorish general Othello marries Desdemona, slighted Venetian ensign Iago plots to ruin Othello's reputation. As Iago's machinations unfold, the characters are cast into a chaotic web of deception, betrayal, and murder. Jeremy Camp

Saturday, July 2, 2022 - 7:30 p.m., Kresge Auditorium

With a record-breaking 41 number-one hits across all radio formats, Jeremy Camp is one of the most popular solo artists in Christian music. Since his debut album *Stay* topped the Christian charts in 2002, the singer, songwriter, and author has sold more than 5 million albums, published two books, won four ASCAP Songwriter of the Year Awards, and earned a Grammy Award nomination. Camp's 12-album discography includes four RIAA Gold-certified albums and instantly recognizable hits such as "I Still Believe," "There Will Be A Day," and "Christ in Me." The King's Singers

Wednesday, July 6, 2022 - 7:30 p.m., Corson Auditorium

For more than 50 years, vocal sextet The King's Singers have served as global ambassadors for choral excellence. Internationally renowned for their precise musical craft and British charm, the ensemble has appeared in the world's finest concert halls and earned two Grammy Awards, an Emmy Award, and a place in *Gramophone's* Hall of Fame. The ensemble's diverse repertoire ranges from popular music transcriptions to works commissioned from the greatest composers of our time, including John Tavener, Eric Whitacre, Judith Bingham, and Luciano Berio. An Evening With Air Supply Saturday, July 9, 2022 - 7:30 p.m., Kresge Auditorium

Air Supply became an overnight sensation when their U.S.-debut single, "Lost in Love," rocketed to the top of the charts in 1980. They quickly secured their place in the soundtrack of the decade with three platinum-certified albums and seven more top-ten singles, including timeless hits such as "All Out of Love," "Every Woman in the World," and "The One That You Love." Four decades later, the Australian Recording Industry Association Hall of Famers remain instantly recognizable for their effortless harmonies and unforgettable ballads.

Buddy Guy and John Hiatt & The Goners featuring Sonny Landreth Wednesday, July 20, 2022 - 7:30 p.m., Kresge Auditorium

Praised by Eric Clapton as "the best guitar player alive," Buddy Guy remains one of the brightest stars of the blues genre. The Rock and Roll Hall of Famer has produced 18 solo albums across his six-decade career, earning eight Grammy Awards, a Recording Academy Lifetime Achievement Award, and a National Medal of the Arts along the way. Prolific singer-songwriter John Hiatt and his backing band, The Goners, join Guy for a one-in-a-kind collaboration. Lauded by *The Los Angeles Times* as "one of rock's most astute singer-songwriters of the last 40 years," Hiatt has produced 22 albums, earned ten Grammy nominations, and won the Americana Music Association's Lifetime Achievement Award for Songwriting. Don't miss your chance to see two incredible artists in one unparalleled evening of music.

Detroit Symphony Orchestra

The duo's growing list of accolades also includes five Country Music Association Awards, five Academy of Country Music Awards, and the 2019 ASCAP Vanguard Award.
