COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS

Cristian Măcelaru

Current Music Director of the Orchestre National de France in Paris, one of Europe's leading orchestras, GRAMMY® Award winning conductor Cristian Măcelaru is Chief Conductor of the WDR Sinfonieorchester, Artistic Director and Principal Conductor of Interlochen's World Youth Symphony Orchestra, and Music Director and Conductor of the Cabrillo Festival of Contemporary Music.

Cristian Măcelaru was born in Timișoara, Romania, and comes from a musical family. As the youngest of ten children, he received instrumental lessons at an early age — like all his siblings — in his case on the violin. His studies took him from Romania to Interlochen Arts Academy, University of Miami in Florida, and Rice University in Houston. Măcelaru was the youngest concertmaster in the history of the Miami Symphony Orchestra and made his Carnegie Hall debut with that orchestra at the age of 19. Măcelaru now regularly performs at the podium of the best American and European orchestras. In January 2020, Măcelaru received his first-ever GRAMMY® Award for conducting the Decca Classics recording of Wynton Marsalis' Violin Concerto with Nicola Benedetti and the Philadelphia Orchestra.

THE COLORS OF ACADEMIC ATTIRE

The traditional pageantry of an academic procession is an impressive spectacle. Its significance may seem concealed behind a baffling array of rich and somber gowns of varying cuts and vividly contrasting multicolored hoods; yet within this kaleidoscope, there lies an orderly and time-honored system of displaying the symbols of scholarly attainment.

Although some American colleges and universities adopted the English custom of academic dress from founding, it was not until the late 19th century that academic attire came into general use for ceremonial occasions. The uniformity of the American system of academic heraldry, resulting from a code established by the American Council of Education, indicates the degree conveyed by an academic costume; the field, or faculty, in which it was earned; and the institution by which it was granted.

The most basic of the three parts of the scholar's costume, the gown, differs for the three levels of degrees primarily in the sleeve. The pointed sleeve of the bachelor's gown distinguishes it from the squared end of the master's sleeve, which reaches nearly to the knee and is slit above the elbow. The doctor's gown has

bell-shaped sleeves, and is the only one of the three that is permitted with velvet trimming on the front facings and cross bars on the upper portion of the arm.

The American mortarboard, derived from the Oxford cap, is black like the gown. Its tassel, for holders of the bachelor's and master's degrees, is usually black, although in some instances color may be used to identify the faculty of the scholar. Gold tassels are reserved for holders of doctoral degrees and heads of institutions.

It is the hood that provides academic regalia its color and offers the most information about its owner. The silk lining bears the color or colors, of the degree-granting institution; its velvet edging displays the color assigned to that area of study in which the degree was taken. The length of the hood and the width of the edging increase with the level of the degree.

Variations in this uniformity may be observed in the special gowns worn by the governing officers of a number of institutions, the colored robes of the graduates of a few universities which have departed from the tradition of black, and the diversified attire of holders of degrees from foreign universities.

SENIOR SPEAKER Eloise Hartings

President Devey, Dr. Colatosti, members of the Board, faculty, parents, family and friends,

Good morning and thank you for joining us to celebrate our graduation!

It's hard to imagine being here. I have been thinking recently about my first music lesson. I was probably about six years old. That was something. I've also been thinking about the day I asked my parents if I could go to an arts boarding school. That was really something! Yet, here we are, and how far we've come. None of us would be here today if it weren't for the few people who have truly invested themselves in our lives. On behalf of the Class of 2022 - to our parents and guardians, we sincerely thank you. Our success is your success.

I'd also like to say a few words to everyone here at Interlochen. There is a great story about United States President John F. Kennedy touring NASA not long after he challenged the nation to go to the moon. After visiting the astronauts and the engineers, he saw a man in a hallway mopping the floor. Kennedy stopped to ask the man what his job was at the space center. The gentleman looked at him and said, "Mr. President, my job is to put a man on the moon." To all of the staff at the Academy – from those out front to those behind the scenes and everyone in between – we couldn't reach this milestone in our lives without each of you and your dedication to educating the next generation of citizen artists. Thank you.

As a flute player, I sit in the dead center of the orchestra. Best seat in the house, in my opinion. And during my time as an Academy student, I've had the opportunity to perform all kinds of music from contemporary world premieres to iconic masterpieces. But no matter the work, in every performance, there's this vibrant energy in the air that is so alive, it's almost as if you can reach out and touch it. This electricity builds and builds until the maestro cuts off the final chord and something very special happens. In complete contrast to the wave of sound that filled the room just moments before, everything falls silent. This is my favorite part of the concert and the moment that stays with me when I leave.

As that final chord leaves the hall, there is quiet - a moment of peace - as we wait for the applause. It goes by quickly for the audience, but as a performer, it can feel like a lifetime sitting in silence and waiting for the next moment to begin. It's a moment filled with anticipation, a sense of accomplishment, a sense of closure, and, occasionally, even a sense of loss. It is a pure, shared moment for the performers and it only ends when one brave audience member starts to clap.

There are many different types of silence. Silence is used to express honor, disapproval, shock, confusion, and gratitude. It occurs when someone doesn't know what to say or when there simply is nothing left to say. It allows one time to think, to reflect, and to process. Silence does not occur; it is created and when used appropriately, it expresses what words cannot.

Sometimes, we long for silence - when life is busy, when we have what seems like an impossible amount of work to do. Or, when the TJ fire alarm goes off at 2 am - in February.

Other times, we feel like the silence is forced upon us. Maybe life isn't going your way. You feel lost or you have personal troubles. Maybe your lung collapses - twice - when you're supposed to be auditioning for college. Or perhaps, the world shuts down for a global pandemic, making everything we love doing nearly impossible.

Those periods of silence can feel incredibly empty and we so often overlook the possibility in them. It is so easy to convince ourselves that "the sky is falling", but, if we can only recognize it, these moments hold a very specific opportunity for reflection on what has passed, peace of the present, and anticipation for the future. By being open to seeing the possibilities in even the most challenging of times, we can see not stagnance, but silence. And recognize that silence is not an absence, but rather a presence of something that sound can't capture - even if it lasts for only a few seconds.

And like that magical moment in a concert, this day is an instance of silence in our lives between the work that has brought us here and the excitement that awaits. But, for now, the gallery has closed. The credits are rolling. The chapter has ended. We've hit the last note. We've struck the final pose. The curtain has dropped and this is our final bow. The ultimate chord of our Interlochen symphony has left the hall and we now stand in the space between in silence. A pure, shared moment, anticipating what will come, that will be over in an instant, but stay with us for a lifetime.


