BIOS

MARTYNA MAJOK (author) was born in Bytom, Poland and raised in Jersey and Chicago. She was awarded the 2018 Pulitzer Prize for Drama for her play, Cost of Living. Other plays include Sanctuary City, Queens, and Ironbound, which have been produced across American and international stages. Awards include The Academy of Arts and Letters' Benjamin Hadley Danks Award for Exceptional Playwriting, The Lucille Lortel Award for Outstanding New Play, The Greenfield Prize, as the first female recipient in drama, The Champions of Change Award from the NYC Mayor's Office, The Francesca Primus Prize, two Jane Chambers Playwriting Awards, The Lanford Wilson Prize, The Lilly Award's Stacey Mindich Prize, Helen Merrill Emerging Playwright Award, Charles MacArthur Award for Outstanding Original New Play from The Helen Hayes Awards, Jean Kennedy Smith Playwriting Award, ANPF Women's Invitational Prize, David Calicchio Prize, Global Age Project Prize, NYTW 2050 Fellowship, NNPN Smith Prize for Political Playwriting, and Merage Foundation Fellowship for The American Dream. Majok studied at Yale School of Drama, Juilliard, University of Chicago, and Jersey public schools. She was a 2012-2013 NNPN playwright-in-residence, the 2015-2016 PoNY Fellow at the Lark Play Development Center, and a 2018-2019 Hodder Fellow at Princeton University. Majok is currently writing a musical adaptation of

The Great Gatsby, with music by Florence Welch and Thomas Bartlett, and developing TV and film for HBO, Plan B, and Pastel.

KRISTA WILLIAMS (director) is thrilled to be returning to the Interlochen Shakespeare Festival to work with Interlochen alumni on this remarkable play. The rest of the year she is in New York where she works as a Dramaturg and Director. She works primarily on new American plays and has developed work with hundreds of contemporary playwrights as well as adapting and serving as Dramaturg for many off-Broadway productions. In recent years she has also started to work in story development for film, audio and television. She holds a Master of Fine Arts from Yale School of Drama. She lives in Brooklyn with her husband and their two wild children. She is a proud alumna of Interlochen Arts Academy.

AREZU TAVAKOLI (G) is a proud Interlochen Arts Academy and Camp alumna who is delighted to be making her Interlochen Shakespeare Festival debut this summer! Born in Flint, Michigan to parents from Tucuman, Argentina, and Isfahan, Iran, Tavakoli is honored to be sharing a story that is so close to home. A rising sophomore theatre major at Fordham University and an incoming student of the Stella Adler Studio of Acting, some of her favorite credits include: *In the Heights* (Vanessa), *Fucking-A* (Prisoner/Female Swing), *We're Still Here* (Aquilina), *A Chorus Line* (Sheila), and *Juana Inez De La Cruz* (Juana Inez).

JORDAN WALLACE (Henry) is elated to be making their Interlochen Shakespeare Festival debut. Wallace is a 2016 Interlochen Arts Camp alum. They graduated from Interlochen Arts Academy in 2017 before continuing their theatre education at The Theatre School at DePaul University. Over the past year, Wallace fulfilled a residency with the South Chicago Dance Theatre as a theatre educator to elementary and middle school students. Recent credits include: Luchadora! (Green Luchador/Ring Announcer), Our Lady of Kibeho (Villager/Ensemble), and Chicago Fire (Employee).

MISHKA YAROVOY (B) is thrilled to be making his Interlochen Shakespeare Festival debut. Born in Mexico to Russian parents, Yarovoy spent most of his life living between Mexico, Russia, and the United States before settling permanently in the U.S. at the age of 14. He graduated from Interlochen Arts Academy in 2019. Currently a theatre major at Boston University, his previous credits include: *The Inheritance* (Regional premier, Speakeasy Stage); *Romeo and Juliet* (Apollinaire Theatre); *She Eats Apples* (Boston Artist's Theatre); *Stupid F**king Bird* (Parallel 45). 
