

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Jesus Christ Superstar tells the story of a charismatic 1st-century rabbi who may, or may not, have been the savior of humankind. For me, it's the perfect show for Interlochen because it mixes foundational concepts in Western culture, religion, and philosophy with contemporary music and sensibilities. Jesus Christ Superstar imagines the founder of Christianity as a 1970s rock star.

Our production continues the spirit of creativity and playfulness of Tim Rice and Andrew Lloyd Webber's musical by taking a nod from sci-fi and fantasy works with messianic themes, particularly the 1965 novel *Dune* and its subsequent 1984 film version, *Star Wars* (1977), *The NeverEnding Story* (1984), and *Mad Max Beyond Thunderdome* (1985). Our production is also heavily influenced by the 1973 film version of *Jesus Christ Superstar* directed by Norman Jewison. Larry Marshall, the actor who played Simon in the film, is a friend and mentor of mine, and for years I've heard him tell stories of the innovative way the film was made at the height of Israel/Palestine tensions. Everything was shot on the same soil Jesus and his followers walked, and the tanks in the film were real.

I opened all roles to all students regardless of gender. For me, a radical contemporary fictionalization of the monumental events of Western civilization requires us to take a freer position on gender. Our community of students and faculty have a far less rigid view of gender, and I want that new reality reflected on stage in a significant way.

I believe students can perform in this production without holding any particular religious view. Our goal is to present a "What if?" version of historical and legendary events that makes no specific religious statement but rather explores the phenomena of celebrity, colonialism, physical violence, gender, love, and sacrifice. We seek to blur time and allow the students to step out of their own reality into a fictional world and to give the audience a new way of experiencing familiar stories.

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UPCOMING HIGHLIGHTS

Los Hermanos/The Brothers: Documentary Screening and Q&A Wednesday, Nov. 16 | Corson Auditorium

Politics, music, and family collide in Marcia Jarmel and Ken Schneider's moving documentary, Los Hermanos (The Brothers). Separated for decades by tensions between the United States and Cuba, two brothers—pianist Aldo and violinist Ilmar—reunite for their first collaboration as professional musicians. Featuring Aldo's genre-defying score and performances by Joshua Bell and the Harlem Quartet, Los Hermanos offers a nuanced exploration of estranged nations, fraternal love, and the unifying power of music.

The screening will be followed by a Q&A session with directors Marcia Jarmel and Ken Schneider, and the Gavilán brothers.

Orchestra and Wind Symphony: Reflections Thursday, Nov. 17 | Corson Auditorium

Experience two of Interlochen Arts Academy's finest instrumental ensembles in one performance! Under the direction of Dr. Leslie Dunner and Dr. Matthew Schlomer respectively, the Arts Academy Orchestra and Wind Symphony will perform a diverse program of classical and contemporary works. Repertoire for the evening will include Hindemith's Symphonic Metamorphosis of Themes by Carl Maria von Weber, J.S. Bach's Fantasia in G, and Adolphus Hailstork's American Guernica. Guest soloist Renee Skerik will join the Wind Symphony for a performance of James Syler's Love Among the Ruins.

Promenade by María Irene Fornés Friday, Dec. 2 – Sunday, Dec. 4 | Harvey Theatre

Witness María Irene Fornés' Obie Award-winning fantasia of song and dance as the Interlochen Arts Academy Theatre Division performs *Promenade*. Two escaped convicts navigate an unnamed city, pursued by a dim-witted police officer. Along the way, the duo encounters a diverse cast of the city's citizens, including a disgruntled maid, a trio of vapid socialites, a distracted soldier, and the city's mayor. Don't miss a rarely performed production hailed by The New York Times as "bizarre and sneakily thrilling" and "a joy from start to finish."

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
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

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
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
