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Myles-Amir J. Riley (IAA 12-13, IAC 09), a Detroit, Michigan native, is a Seminarian, Creative, and Organizational Leader, currently pursuing a Masters of Divinity at Yale University Divinity School. He serves as the Administrator of Mission within the City of New Haven's Department of Cultural Affairs, focusing on cultural equity and spiritual uplift. Previously, Myles worked alongside Department of Energy laboratories as a Government Program Manager, while also serving as a Music Project Manager to award-winning gospel artists. As a rising leader in culture, community development, social justice, and faith, Myles-Amir has worked with leading musicians across genres in philanthropy and creative arts to cultivate hope and positive communal change, including projects with Usher's New Look Foundation and the Sphinx Organization. Myles has performed and recorded at the Kennedy Center, bringing awareness to racial violence, as well as, performed at NYU alongside formerly incarcerated individuals, bringing awareness to the perils of mass incarceration. As an oboist and vocalist, Myles-Amir has appeared on Detroit Performs and has performed with notable artists like Rev. Dr. John Paul McGee and Damien Sneed. At Yale, he serves in various roles, addressing students' spiritual and practical needs. Myles is a graduate of Interlochen Arts Academy and Vanderbilt University.
