SENIOR SPEAKER

Remi Baker

For the past few months, on every weekday at 12:20 p.m. on the dot, I've made my way to Stone Cafeteria to have lunch with a specific group of friends. And I think we'd all agree that it's not ever just a meal, but rather a meeting of the minds. Some of the best inside jokes are manufactured, group games are administered; it is the most intense 30 and some minutes of my day. One of my favorite traditions we used to share was called question of the day, a ritual of picking apart each others' answers to a daily query. Our discussions, debates, and epiphanies have made me more of a critical thinker than ever before.

Encounters like these have delineated what we can all recognize as our "Interlochen experience." I'm surprised not to hear a grumble from the audience, because I think many of us could agree this phrase has reached cliché status. It's up there with love at first sight and silver linings, but it's overused for a reason. Everyone present today has our own personal relationship with this place, whether it's your first time here or your last. I'd describe our Interlochen experiences as spider webs: some are small and just starting to form; others are incredibly intricate, and no one is the same.

Difference is such a monumental concept of life here at Interlochen. It's not just accepted—it's expected. I learned that during my first Academy orientation event in this very auditorium, when a fellow student played a spontaneous rendition of "Hey Jude" with one foot on the piano and followed it with the splits. I truly had no idea what I was in for. But back to my point. Differences are celebrated here; so celebrated, in fact, that they have their own point on a pentagon we call "The Interlochen 5." This is a point I believe the Class of 2024 has specialized in during our time here, and what I want to focus on today: Interdisciplinary Perspective and Collaboration. "Effective, daily collaboration in the classroom and across seven arts majors draws the best from each individual to achieve something no one person can accomplish on their own." Now, clearly, our class has embodied this interdisciplinary perspective in many spaces on campus. It is evident in this year's student representative executive board, where six dynamic women from five different majors represent our senior class. It is evident in massive productions like this year's Edmonia that have shattered disciplinary boundaries. It is evident in my roommate who can play the fiddle and also capture complex emotions with the stroke of a paintbrush. I can say with confidence that our class has stayed rooted in collaboration and planted the seeds that will flourish for years to come.

It would be so easy for me to stand up here and just celebrate all the things we've accomplished together: to cue the fireworks, to cut the cake. I mean, that's what commencement is supposed to be, right? Commemorating a year of practice room lighting, never-ending waves of winter, discovering new mediums of art, and new mediums of caffeine. A celebration, clean and simple. Well, if there's anything I know about my class of interdisciplinarians, it's that we never do anything simply. Like our time here, this moment should feel beautifully and alarmingly challenging. So I challenge all of you to take this interdisciplinary way of learning and turn it into an interdisciplinary way of living.

I think many of us feel we have to separate our lives at Interlochen from our lives in the "real world." Because in the real world, things cannot be interdisciplinary or multifaceted. Everything must be either/or. I used to be a victim of this myth too, until a teacher of mine presented to me the logic of either/and—the notion that we as students, and now we as adults, don't have to choose between different ideas. The answer can be answers, the musical genre can be a mosaic of genres, and the life we each pursue after today never has to stay stagnant.

There is one small thread of my Interlochen spider web that has led me to this realization. I had the privilege of taking the legendary Elements of Poetry course last spring. One class, Dr. Cavallaro decided to abandon our reading and writing routine and played a song. "Write down the words you hear," she said. It sounded like an easy enough exercise... until a muffled voice started singing through her computer speakers, most lyrics indecipherable and layered in soundscape. By the end, each of my classmates and I had distinct ideas of what the song meant. What I heard as "bird bath" someone else heard as "wrong map." What they heard as "evergreen" I heard as "let us see." We'd just listened to the same piece of music, yet reached completely different conclusions from it. But we were okay with that. In fact, we were moved by it. In the same way we left the classroom that day, we will leave Interlochen in a few hours having shared its unique experience, but taking away from it what we've learned from each other and from ourselves.

We, the Class of 2024, have been curating this interdisciplinary, or rather, kaleidoscopic way of living. It is now our challenge, and our duty, to take this mindset with us into the world—to show others the combinations of shapes and colors they have yet to see. Coming to school here has been like taking a seat at one of the world's biggest lunch tables. It is a spread of intelligence, culture, camaraderie, and art that we've been so lucky to consume. But now it's time to say goodbye to Stone, it's time to find some new friends to sit with, and some new topics to debate. There are more masterpieces to craft, more injustices to be fought, and more bracing lunch conversations to be had. None of us are leaving Interlochen satisfied. We're leaving hungry, which I dare to say is far better.

THE COLORS OF ACADEMIC ATTIRE

The traditional pageantry of an academic procession is an impressive spectacle. Its significance may seem concealed behind a baffling array of rich and somber gowns of varying cuts and vividly contrasting multicolored hoods; yet within this kaleidoscope, there lies an orderly and time-honored system of displaying the symbols of scholarly attainment.

Although some American colleges and universities adopted the English custom of academic dress from founding, it was not until the late 19th century that academic attire came into general use for ceremonial occasions. The uniformity of the American system of academic heraldry, resulting from a code established by the American Council of Education, indicates the degree conveyed by an academic costume; the field, or faculty, in which it was earned; and the institution by which it was granted.

The most basic of the three parts of the scholar's costume, the gown, differs for the three levels of degrees primarily in the sleeve. The pointed sleeve of the bachelor's gown distinguishes it from the squared end of the master's sleeve, which reaches nearly to the knee and is slit above the elbow. The doctor's gown has

bell-shaped sleeves, and is the only one of the three that is permitted with velvet trimming on the front facings and cross bars on the upper portion of the arm.

The American mortarboard, derived from the Oxford cap, is black like the gown. Its tassel, for holders of the bachelor's and master's degrees, is usually black, although in some instances color may be used to identify the faculty of the scholar. Gold tassels are reserved for holders of doctoral degrees and heads of institutions.

It is the hood that provides academic regalia its color and offers the most information about its owner. The silk lining bears the color or colors, of the degree-granting institution; its velvet edging displays the color assigned to that area of study in which the degree was taken. The length of the hood and the width of the edging increase with the level of the degree.

Variations in this uniformity may be observed in the special gowns worn by the governing officers of a number of institutions, the colored robes of the graduates of a few universities which have departed from the tradition of black, and the diversified attire of holders of degrees from foreign universities.



Lukas Drysdale


