Dolly Parton once said, "If you see someone without a smile, give them one of yours." That spirit—boundless generosity, resilience, warmth, and an unshakable belief in the power of love—runs through every note of her music. With this revue, we invite you to step into Dolly's world: a place where heartache and hope dance together, where love is hard-won but worth the fight, and where joy is something you make, not something you wait for.

Dolly's music is the great equalizer. Whether she's singing about working "9 to 5" or longing for a love lost in "I Will Always Love You," her songs speak to something elemental in all of us. They remind us that we are never alone in our struggles, that dreams are worth chasing, and that laughter is as necessary as tears.

Our cast—young artists from Interlochen's Musical Theatre program—have poured their hearts into bringing this music to life. They have discovered, as we all do when we spend time with Dolly, that these songs aren't just melodies; they're stories, confessions, celebrations, and battle cries.

More than anything, this show is a big, warm hug. We want it to wrap its arms around you, to remind you that you belong, that you are seen, and that you are stronger than you know. We hope you laugh, we hope you cry (just a little), and we hope you leave humming a tune and feeling just a bit lighter than when you arrived.
