Congratulations, Class of 2025! We did it. We've made it through a high school journey that's been anything but ordinary. This moment is a testament to our perseverance, the late nights, the stress, the laughter, and everything in between. We've truly earned this day. It's an honor to stand before a room full of incredible artists who've pushed themselves time and time again, debating whether sleep or finishing that project was more important. And let's be honest, sleep usually loses.

Most valedictory addresses start with "Look how far we've come in four years," and while that's a lovely sentiment, we didn't all start our journey together. At Interlochen, everyone brings their unique background and perspective, making each journey distinct. Some of us came from different schools, states, and even different countries. But the magic of this place is that no matter how different our paths were, they all led us here. We built friendships out of intention, not convenience. Every day, we chose to connect, collaborate, and grow. When I first arrived, I believed I had to stand out, to prove myself. But over time, I learned that real success doesn't come from comparison. It comes from collective growth, from resilience, and from choosing to stay present in the process, even when it's hard. I think that mindset shift started as a seed, a quiet thought planted in each of us the moment we took the risk to come here, and over time, it grew.

The bond we share comes from the fact that we've all tried and failed and tried again. We've stepped outside our comfort zones, we've supported each other through the tough moments. And that takes vulnerability. Not the kind where everyone knows your life story, but the kind where you show up and pour your heart into something that matters. The kind where you risk falling short and still keep going.

So although we may not have started as kindergarten friends, the bond we've built this year is just as deep and just as special.

At Interlochen, we challenge ourselves in pursuit of artistic excellence, refining our craft with passion and persistence. But true artistry isn't defined by talent alone, it's fueled by heart. As we graduate, we understand that it is our responsibility to give back to those who have lifted us up. As one of our Theatre faculty, Gulshirin Dubash, teaches, true artistry demands virtuosity not only in technique, but in mindset. It calls for hunger, curiosity, and the courage to lean in. This journey has shaped us into artists of character and empathy, committed to sharing what we've learned and continuing a culture of generosity.

I've seen this firsthand through my work with the amazing philanthropy team (shoutout to Stephanie and Shevawn), where I had the privilege of throwing dodgeballs at President Trey Devey during my very first Act for Art kickoff party. But beyond the fun, I learned that philanthropy is one of the most meaningful principles of our artistic journey. That's why I believe art isn't self-serving. It's a bridge: uniting, healing, and transforming. The impact of art isn't measured in accolades, but in the lives it touches and the change it sparks. This is the legacy we aim to leave behind.

And that's what makes the return of our alumni so poignant. They don't just come back to share their triumphs on grand stages. They return to

How the silence before a performance can feel terrifying, but also sacred. How something as simple as a moment of kindness can be more powerful than any standing ovation.

So yeah, no one really has it all figured out. And in the wise words of Hannah Montana: Nobody's perfect. What really matters isn't perfection; it's authenticity. It's about whether we've inspired, connected, and left the world just a little brighter than we found it.

That's the heart of art, too—not flawless execution, but honest expression. It's a mirror of the human soul, capturing who we are in all our complexity. When we create, we share parts of ourselves with the world, which takes courage. Vulnerability. And yes, sometimes, doubt. Every artist wrestles with the question, "Am I good enough?" THE COLORS OF ACADEMIC ATTIRE

The traditional pageantry of an academic procession is an impressive spectacle. Its significance may seem concealed behind a baffling array of rich and somber gowns of varying cuts and vividly contrasting multicolored hoods; yet within this kaleidoscope, there lies an orderly and time-honored system of displaying the symbols of scholarly attainment.

Although some American colleges and universities adopted the English custom of academic dress from founding, it was not until the late 19th century that academic attire came into general use for ceremonial occasions. The uniformity of the American system of academic heraldry, resulting from a code established by the American Council of Education, indicates the degree conveyed by an academic costume; the field, or faculty, in which it was earned; and the institution by which it was granted.

The most basic of the three parts of the scholar's costume, the gown, differs for the three levels of degrees primarily in the sleeve. The pointed sleeve of the bachelor's gown distinguishes it from the squared end of the master's sleeve, which reaches nearly to the knee and is slit above the elbow. The doctor's gown has

bell-shaped sleeves, and is the only one of the three that is permitted with velvet trimming on the front facings and cross bars on the upper portion of the arm.

The American mortarboard, derived from the Oxford cap, is black like the gown. Its tassel, for holders of the bachelor's and master's degrees, is usually black, although in some instances color may be used to identify the faculty of the scholar. Gold tassels are reserved for holders of doctoral degrees and heads of institutions.

It is the hood that provides academic regalia its color and offers the most information about its owner. The silk lining bears the color or colors, of the degree-granting institution; its velvet edging displays the color assigned to that area of study in which the degree was taken. The length of the hood and the width of the edging increase with the level of the degree.

Variations in this uniformity may be observed in the special gowns worn by the governing officers of a number of institutions, the colored robes of the graduates of a few universities which have departed from the tradition of black, and the diversified attire of holders of degrees from foreign universities.
