DIRECTOR'S NOTES

I am particularly fond of this adaptation of *The Jungle Book* because it gives us a *why* behind these stories instead of just a *what*. We see a young Rudyard Kipling creating his own world with learnable rules to help him understand the unwritten rules of his own human world. As Mowgli learns and grows into his own power, so too does the young Kipling. Historically, Rudyard Kipling built his "jungle" out of half-remembered stories from domestic servants and a heavy portion of imagination. In keeping with that, the "India" of our production isn't really India; it's a collage of ideas, images, and bits of theatre magic. The humans of "India" don't speak Hindi or any other language of that region—they speak the languages that our campers brought into the room. In every case, we use the theatrical/magical tools at our disposal in order to create the "jungle" that gives our campers (and hopefully our audience) the experience they need in order to find their own ways in the world.

I am also rather selfishly drawn to how teacher/student dynamics are presented in this play. Mowgli's teachers instruct, wheedle, and warn, when necessary, but they also give him room to make his own mistakes. Most importantly, they honor the moment when Mowgli must move beyond them and grow into the capabilities that they can't teach. In keeping with that notion, the various melodies you'll hear during our scene shifts come from someone who, just like me, came to these beautiful woods to try to inspire students to surpass him. The composer Percy Grainger, before teaching at Interlochen, spent decades writing his own Jungle Book cycle. You'll hear some snippets of music drawn from or inspired by these works so that perhaps a bit of his voice can continue to teach our campers today.
