Alijah Cambridge

Thank you to President Devey, Camille, faculty and staff, and hello, Interlochen’s graduating class of 2026! It is such an honor to be standing here on this day, which we once thought was so far away. Looking into this crowd, the buzz of change is in full force. When we arrived on this campus, in the middle of nowhere, suitcases in hand, our pockets were filled with hope and nervousness. Then, we were versions of ourselves that we thought we knew, only for Interlochen to quickly show us that we are balls of energy that are constantly changing.

For me, the first spark of my transformation was when I joined my middle school drama club in the pursuit of free pizza. But when I showed up, it dawned upon my adolescent mind that the swirl of emotions I carried—the frustration, restlessness, the anger that I felt for the world, could be molded into something greater. On stage, it became tangible power. For the first time, I realized that I did not have to be ruled by my own emotions. I could shape them. I could shape myself.

Interlochen only expanded on this discovery by opening my eyes to an endless rabbit hole of possibilities. Being surrounded by my peers, who are extraordinarily passionate and talented, ignited a hunger to grasp at each opportunity that was within reach; I discovered I could be a hard-working actor, along with a leader in our community. This led me to serve two years as co-president of the Black Student Union. I also had the chance to provide the interdisciplinary perspective on the Student Representative Board and assist in leadership of the Fighting Blueberry volleyball team. And now, I’m here as your Senior Speaker.

If middle school Allijah saw me up here today, her jaw would be on the floor. She would be in absolute awe that I no longer mitigate my emotions, that I am unapologetically myself, and that I feel everything without shame. I am the person she only fantasized about. This would not have been possible without the generous scholarships that opened my world to Interlochen. My high school journey would have been completely different. Interlochen changes lives.

Our education here did not just focus on technique; it taught each of us how to show up in life, fully and intentionally. Many lessons will ring in all of our heads, but the one lesson that will ring loudest in mine is that “survival is not enough.” True living requires engagement, reflection, and a willingness to carry the lessons of privilege and opportunity forward.

Attending Interlochen, whether that be for four years or just one, is undoubtedly a profound privilege. It is one of a kind and not granted to many. To be seen. To be challenged. To be believed in. And with that privilege comes a responsibility. Wherever this next chapter of our lives leads us, it is our duty to share what we have learned here at Interlochen. To show kindness, to act with integrity, and to create spaces where others feel valued.

The world we are stepping into is not fixed. It is constantly changing, sometimes in ways that feel chaotic or frightening. This is the inescapable reality that is constantly reinforced by the presence of social media. On our screens, we are constantly exposed to the happenings and tragedies all around the globe. Paired with the rapid expansion of AI and the blaring warnings from scientists that our habitat, Mother Earth, is decaying under our feet. We witness suffering, injustice, and the unraveling of systems around us. And it feels like impending doom, a ticking bomb that can explode any second. It is an undeniable fact that the world is about to change in a very drastic way; we’re existing on a precipice. Yet, we are not powerless. The future is unwritten, and so the present does not determine our future. And though it feels like everything is going downhill, we must not eliminate the possibility of a turn for the better.

And Interlochen has given us tools not to escape that chaos, but to respond to it. To create meaning, to intervene, to shape our grief and anger into something that matters. To be witnesses, participants, and catalysts in the world that needs us.

These tools were given to us by our Interlochen faculty. The academic, arts, residence life, Stone staff, and cleaning staff: Everyone behind the scenes of this school has cared for each of us as if we were their own children; their belief in our success never faltered. They have been pillars of support and beacons of hope. With their guidance, we are standing here today, ready to leave this place with more than knowledge or skill. We’ll leave with confidence, curiosity, and the courage to transform the world.

So, as we step forward, let us remember that the education, the opportunities, and the trust we were given here are not ours to keep for ourselves. They are ours to share. To use. To make the world a place where more people are seen, believed in, and encouraged to grow. Go out into this world and be the first to step up. Let us leave here with gratitude, courage, and the resolve to be the people the world needs us to be. Congratulations, Class of 2026. Thank you.

THE COLORS OF ACADEMIC ATTIRE

The traditional pageantry of an academic procession is an impressive spectacle. Its significance may seem concealed behind a baffling array of rich and somber gowns of varying cuts and vividly contrasting multicolored hoods; yet within this kaleidoscope, there lies an orderly and time-honored system of displaying the symbols of scholarly attainment.

Although some American colleges and universities adopted the English custom of academic dress from founding, it was not until the late 19th century that academic attire came into general use for ceremonial occasions. The uniformity of the American system of academic heraldry, resulting from a code established by the American Council of Education, indicates the degree conveyed by an academic costume; the field, or faculty, in which it was earned; and the institution by which it was granted.

The most basic of the three parts of the scholar's costume, the gown, differs for the three levels of degrees primarily in the sleeve. The pointed sleeve of the bachelor's gown distinguishes it from the squared end of the master's sleeve, which reaches nearly to the knee and is slit above the elbow. The doctor's gown has

bell-shaped sleeves, and is the only one of the three that is permitted with velvet trimming on the front facings and cross bars on the upper portion of the arm.

The American mortarboard, derived from the Oxford cap, is black like the gown. Its tassel, for holders of the bachelor's and master's degrees, is usually black, although in some instances color may be used to identify the faculty of the scholar. Gold tassels are reserved for holders of doctoral degrees and heads of institutions.

It is the hood that provides academic regalia its color and offers the most information about its owner. The silk lining bears the color or colors, of the degree-granting institution; its velvet edging displays the color assigned to that area of study in which the degree was taken. The length of the hood and the width of the edging increase with the level of the degree.

Variations in this uniformity may be observed in the special gowns worn by the governing officers of a number of institutions, the colored robes of the graduates of a few universities which have departed from the tradition of black, and the diversified attire of holders of degrees from foreign universities.
