Artistic directors Kyle Stachnik and Joseph Skerik—both Interlochen Arts Academy alumni with deep roots in the Grand Traverse region—created this ensemble to showcase some of the most sought-after chamber musicians in the country.

Our members include recipients of the Avery Fisher Career Grant—among the highest honors for emerging instrumentalists in the United States—as well as top prizewinners in the 2023 and 2025 Young Concert Artist Guild Competition. These distinctions reflect a level of artistry recognized on the most competitive stages worldwide.

In addition to their performing careers, many of our artists hold faculty and teaching positions at universities and conservatories, shaping the next generation of musicians while maintaining active international careers.

As dedicated chamber musicians, they have appeared at premier festivals including Lincoln Center Chamber Players, Kneisel Hall, Kronberg Academy, Marlboro Music, Music@Menlo, Ravinia Steans Institute, Verbier Academy, and Yellow Barn.
